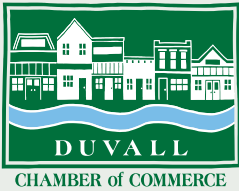

Duvall Creative Arts Guild

The Duvall Creative Arts Guild launched in January 2015, and is comprised of eight Duvall artists who gather once a month to experience joy and community through creating art together. The Valley Chicks & Seasonal Vintage Markets

Like the old and the new? Love your vintage, but need something different, reimagined, and redefined to go with it? Look no further – Duvall’s own Valley Chicks have you covered. Still going strong, Valley Chicks is a group of local artists, creative re-imaginers, up-cyclers, and vintage fans. A place where questions may be asked, information is shared, and items are available for sale. Several members have successfully launched their own small businesses!

With Vintage & Artist Market events held on a quarterly basis, every market is a little different, sometimes with the added fun of a photo booth or vintage style photographer, artisan baker or soap maker, is a casual, family / dog friendly community event.

The Valley Chicks Vintage & Artist Market features 20+ vendors and showcases the work of its amazing members and other local artists.

Art in Bloom

Presented locally by the Duvall Foundation for the Arts (DFA), Art in Bloom is a signature summer kick-off event for Arts in the city of Duvall. It’s a great “date night” for mom and dad, who can have an evening away, then bring the kiddos back the next day and show off the interesting pieces of art and sculpture observed or purchased the night before. Art in Bloom starts the summer outdoor art season with a beautiful gala and weekend long garden art show. Guests can stroll slowly through beautiful Kokopelli Gardens, enjoy live music, sculpture, and intricate pieces of garden art, then support local artists by purchasing a picture perfect piece. In 2016, Art in Bloom will be held the last weekend in June (the 24th through the 26th). Proceeds go to the participating artists and also help fund scholarships given year-round by the DFA.

SandBlast Festival of the Arts

Feet in the sand. Sand carving tools ready to go. Favorite local bands playing. Community Theatre. SandBlast Festival of the Arts mixes all of these arts into one glorious weekend. Featuring a local musical line-up of at least 12 different acts, a theatre performance by Cascade Community Theatre, many local art vendors, and a weekend long sand carving event on the beach in McCormick Park, SandBlast is a must-see, FREE, family friendly event. Support DFA by picking up a commemorative t-shirt designed by local artist Dan Cautrell. SandBlast Festival of the Arts 2016 will be held on July 16th and 17th.

Summer Stage

Pack up the family, grab a picnic dinner (or try a meal from a local food truck), and head down to McCormick Park, because Summer Stage is the hottest (and coolest place) to be on Wednesday nights all summer long. Set in Duvall’s scenic riverside McCormick Park, this outdoor summer concert series offers six evenings of free family entertainment with an eclectic array of outstanding performances. With the new addition of a Beer and Wine Garden, there is something for everyone to enjoy while listening to great local music. All performances run Wednesdays, 7:00 to 8:30pm, in the park. Patrons are encouraged to bring blankets, chairs, and picnic food to enjoy during the concert. Dance through the long summer evenings by the river, or just sit and relax, and let the music and natural setting wash over you. See you at the park!

Duvall Art & Wine Walk

A beautiful evening stroll through Historic Old Town Duvall, walking with your family or loved one and observing (and purchasing) some of the best local art and wine is what the Duvall Art & Wine Walk is all about. Closing out the summer arts season and presented by the Duvall Cultural Commission, this event partners local businesses in Duvall with artists to display their work for one evening. The public is invited to stroll into the businesses and view and/or purchase works of art. This juried event aims to showcase professional artists from the Snoqualmie Valley as well as regional artists of note. In addition to artwork, sumptuous local wine is featured for tasting (for a nominal fee) and various local musicians are sprinkled throughout the event adding to the ambiance. Don’t miss this event usually held in early September.

Cascade Community Theatre

Did you know that Duvall has its own professional community theatre group, bringing local productions to the Snoqualmie Valley all year long? Cascade Community Theatre (CCT) productions offer many types and genres of performing arts to the community. Whether it’s A Christmas Carol during the holiday season, Shakespeare adaptations during the summer, or the young elementary age and middle school kids participating in the CCT Youth theater program, CCT does it all! Check out www.cctplays.org to support this great organization.

Northwest Art Center (NWAC)

NWAC’s Visual and Digital Arts Program is located in Old Town Duvall and serves residents of the entire Snoqualmie Valley region. NWAC programs are staffed by working artists who, in addition to honing their own craft, provide quality visual art education to approximately 260 students per year in their non-profit arts education program. Students range in age from 5 through adult, including seniors. NWAC offers classes and workshops on ceramics, drawing, and painting, and have recently expanded their program to digital arts education. In addition to in-house education, each year over 1,000 community members participate in NWAC community art events and experiences, including documentary art films, wine and paint nights, open studio days, art walks, and gallery shows.

Duvall Visitor Center

An unmistakably charming old red building in the heart of Main Street houses the Duvall Visitor Center (DVC), a treasure of Duvall's heritage dating from the early 1900's. Today, the DVC is run by a coalition of community groups who share the common goal of providing a warm, inviting gathering place for visitors and locals to learn about Duvall's history and thriving business community. Jointly operated by the City of Duvall, the Duvall Chamber of Commerce, the Duvall Civic Club, the Duvall Foundation for the Arts, and Cascade Community Theatre, the DVC has hosted over 7,000 guests and has served more than 70 organizations and groups over the past two years, making it a central resource for the community.

The DVC serves as a place where people visiting Duvall and the Snoqualmie Valley can obtain brochures and information about local businesses, points of interest, transportation routes, public trails, community events, and more. The large top floor is frequently rented to community groups and citizens for many different activities including art shows, fundraisers, scout meetings, theatrical performances, school functions, dance rehearsals, and business meetings. Visitors are welcomed with free refreshments (water and cookies) sponsored by local businesses. Dedicated volunteers staff the DVC year-round.

Get Outdoors

Put your outdoor shoes on because Duvall has many opportunities to explore nature year-round! Duvall also offers a wide variety of year-round activities and services for everyone, making it a wonderful place to raise a family or to enjoy a day exploring a local farm or community event. The best part is many of these activities are low-cost or FREE.

Hiking

Snoqualmie Valley Trail routes through Duvall’s natural areas, parks, and farmland and is a wonderful place for runners, walkers, horseback riders, and mountain bikers. A family-friendly area, the trail borders the tranquil Snoqualmie River and even traverses an occasional railroad trestle. The trail is accessible from several areas, including Depot Park and Taylor’s Landing. No permits are required.

Cherry Creek Falls in Markworth State Forest, located just east of Duvall, is Duvall’s hidden gem. Hike beneath amazingly beautiful old-growth trees to a spectacular 25-foot waterfall. The trail is relatively flat and approximately five miles round-trip. A special feature here is that spawning salmon actually make it all the way up the creek to the falls. Although accessible year-round, it makes an especially pleasant summer hike. The falls are a great spot to stop for a snack, kick off your shoes, and spend some time wading and splashing in the water. No permits are required.

Wallace Falls State Park in nearby Gold Bar is a good long day hike with breathtaking views of several large waterfalls. Located in the foothills of the Cascades with an elevation gain of about 2,000 feet over three miles, this is a more difficult hike. But you don’t need to go all the way to the top to experience the waterfalls. If you choose, you can stop at the lower or middle falls. WA State Park Discovery Pass required.

Bridal Veil Falls & Lake Serene east of Gold Bar in the Mount Baker Snoqualmie National Forest is an amazing, yet strenuous hike with 22 switchbacks. As you hike up in elevation, the diversity of the forest is incredible. This hike has many different observation points. You can experience Bridal Veil Falls from the bottom or hike your way to the top. If you make it all the way to the top, you’ll find a beautiful alpine lake nestled in between trees and steep mountain walls. Northwest Forest Pass Required.

Tolt MacDonald King County Regional Park in nearby Carnation is an amazing spot. Within this park is the confluence of the Tolt and Snoqualmie Rivers. Great flat hiking or steep hiking options are available, including a 500-foot suspension bridge across the Snoqualmie River. In fall, this is a great place to see salmon spawning and watch other wildlife such as Bald Eagles. This park also offers locations for camping and picnicking. No permits are required.

Mount Si and Little Si lie to the south in North Bend. Both trails are extremely popular and crowded, but offer phenomenal views at the top. Little Si is more accessible to families with a 5 mile round-trip hike and 1300 feet elevation gain. Mount Si is for serious hikers, with nearly 4000 feet of elevation gain in the 4 miles to the top. A Discover Pass is required. Parking is extremely limited, so from June through September, use the new SnoValley Adventure Shuttle: www.compassoutdooradventures.com/shuttle.

Find details and directions for these hikes and many more in the area by visiting the Washington Trails Association at www.wta.org.

Bicycling

There are a multitude of recreational cycling options in the Snoqualmie Valley for any age and experience level. Note that all cyclists in King County are required to wear a bicycle helmet by law.

Road Biking

Road biking is a popular activity on the rural roads surrounding Duvall, and cyclists may use paths, bike lanes, shoulders, or travel lanes as suits their safety needs. There are several organized rides through the valley each summer and cyclists and motorists are encouraged to practice safety and share the road. A comprehensive bicycling guide map can be found by visiting www.kingcounty.gov/bike, which can help in planning the safest routes for your ride. In addition, the Cascade Bicycle Club (www.cascade.org) offers classes, information on commuting, group rides and events throughout the Puget Sound.

Also be sure to check out the Marymoor Park Velodrome in Redmond. The track isn’t just for professional racers – amateur riders and spectators are welcome, too! Track cycling lessons are available year round and during the summer, kids can even try their wheels on the track during the Friday night racing series. For more information, visit www.velodrome.org.

Mountain Biking & Soft Surface Trails

King County Parks feature lots of single track and soft surface trails offering exceptional mountain biking. Tolt McDonald Park in Carnation is a popular park for skilled riders, while families will enjoy rides on the Snoqualmie Valley Trail - a regional gravel trail with wide travel paths and nearly flat grades.

Seemingly endless miles of empty gravel logging roads are accessible off Stossel Creek Road in the Markworth State Forest. A Discover Pass is required to park here, and note that this is managed forest land with active logging, so bikers should be cautious or use the area on weekends only. Hunters also regularly frequent this area.

Other opportunities for off-road exploration include the Cherry Valley area with access to Cherry Creek Falls, the Tolt Pipeline Trail, and the Moss Lake area. A few miles away on the Issaquah Plateau is Duthie Hill Park, a mountain biker’s dream that includes about 5 miles of smooth, flowy contoured single track cross-country trails with bermed turns and jumps. For more rides in the area and information, visit the Evergreen Mountain Bike Alliance at www.evergreenmtb.org.

Duvall Parks

Duvall offers over a dozen community and neighborhood parks for kids of any age. All park facilities are ADA accessible. Some park highlights include:

Big Rock Park – ball fields, a playground, and skate park

McCormick Park – picnicking, trails, river access, and events featuring music and arts

Judd Park – playground equipment for all ages

Taylor Landing – picnic tables and shelter, a small playground, and boat launch

Taylor Park – playground equipment, a small picnic shelter, a basketball court, and wooded trails

Get Outdoors

Fox Hollow Park – playground equipment, grassy field, and tennis courts

Geocaching & Letterboxing

Do you and your children love the outdoors, exploring new places, and looking for interesting things? Then you should try geocaching! It’s a treasure hunt right in your own neighborhood! All you need to get started is a GPS-enabled device (like a smartphone with the Geocaching App), coordinates for a geocache and a sense of adventure.

Visit www.geocaching.com to learn more and discover the dozens of hidden caches around Duvall.

Letterboxing is another fun adventure activity. You and your family come up with a creative trail name – your letterboxing identity – and let others know you found their letterbox by leaving an imprint of your own personal stamp in the log book. Discover more about letterboxing and some local hunts to try at <http://bit.ly/1pfxWVw>.

Fishing

The Snoqualmie Valley and nearby areas boast many great fishing spots, like the Snoqualmie River. Several small area lakes such as Lake Margaret, Lake Tye in Monroe, Lake Langlois in Carnation, and Cottage Lake in Woodinville are also great choices for families and are stocked with trout and largemouth bass each year. Fishing licenses are required in Washington and can be purchased online or at True Value Hardware. Free Fishing Weekend in Washington is always the first weekend after the first Monday in June.

Wildlife Viewing

Three **Department of Natural Resources (DNR) wildlife-viewing areas** in the Snoqualmie Valley include Stillwater, Cherry Valley 203, and Crescent Lake 203. Cherry Valley and Crescent Lake are located along State Route 203 North of Duvall and Stillwater is on SR 203 South of Duvall. All are Washington DNR Wildlife Areas requiring a Discover Pass. These areas are great for wildlife viewing especially birds like pheasants, waterfowl, eagles, blue herons, and hawks. Note that during hunting season, hunters may be in these areas.

Moss Lake Natural Area, about five miles southeast of Duvall, is a beautiful wetland surrounded by 372 acres of high-quality habitat, including a sphagnum (heavily moss-filled) bog. Because of its rare diversity and protected status, it’s a great place to spot birds like the Vaux’s Swift and Band-tailed Pigeon. Horseback riders are also welcome. Parking and access are free and a pit toilet is available.

Chinook Bend near Camp Korey in Carnation is another interesting area to explore, with trails and river access spanning 60 acres. The area is quiet and receives relatively little use. Deer and elk can be seen here, and the natural area is also home to a pygmy owl – but at only 6 inches tall, he can take an expert to spot! Parking and access are free and a pit toilet and picnic area are available.

Snoqualmie Falls

Snoqualmie Falls is one of Washington State’s most popular scenic attractions – visited by more than 1.5 million people

every year. At the falls, you will find a two-acre park, gift shop, observation decks with interpretive signage and history of the area, the Salish Lodge and Spa, and the famous 270 foot waterfall. You can also hike a ¾ mile trail to the base of the falls and pass by a hydro powerhouse. Parking and access to the falls is free.

Ski Areas

Duvall is fortunate to be situated between two of the most popular ski areas in western Washington. **The Summit at Snoqualmie** (southeast) and **Steven’s Pass Ski Resort** (northeast) are each less than an hour’s drive from Duvall in the Cascade Mountain range. Snoqualmie is ideal for beginners and features runs on three different mountains, including the challenging **Alpental** area. Steven’s Pass is a little more upscale and caters to skiers of all ages and levels of ability.

Horseback Riding

Horseback riding is one of Duvall’s most popular passions. From world class dressage and eventing training to kid-friendly riding lessons and horse boarding there are numerous trails, equine services, and facilities based in or near Duvall.

Recreation & Trails

Horse enthusiasts will find several places to enjoy easy access to horseback riding in North King County, and details and more information can be found at www.kingcountyexecutivehorsecouncil.org. **Redmond Ridge** boasts over seven riding areas, the largest being the Redmond Watershed trails. This forested gem connects to several other neighborhood and regional trails on the Ridge, including the **Redmond Powerline Trail** and the **Tolt Pipeline Trail**.

Two parks, **Kathryn Taylor Equestrian Park and Farrell McWhirter Park**, offer riding arenas, trail connections to neighboring parks, and picnicking opportunities. **Farrell McWhirter Park** also offers riding programs for children. Riders looking for a longer or more secluded ride can try **Moss Lake Recreation Area** east of Lake Joy or an amble on the **Snoqualmie Valley Trail**, which continues 20 miles south of Duvall through Carnation to near Snoqualmie Falls.

Riders should expect to encounter hikers, dogs and mountain bikers on many of the trails, and state-owned lands require a Discover Pass.

This means the annual family outing to pick strawberries, find the perfect pumpkin, and pick a glorious holiday tree requires only a few minutes drive! It is always a good idea to bring cash and call ahead to your destination to confirm availability and hours, as small farms can sell out quickly. Also be sure to dress for the conditions – in the summer this means sunblock, a hat, and water. In the fall and winter, dress in layers and break out the mud boots!

Today, Duvall has over 24 different non-profit groups that provide opportunities for involvement of all types. Whether it’s a one-time event or an on-going interaction, go ahead and get involved Duvall!

The mission of our local **Acres of Diamonds** organization is to provide a loving, safe and nurturing environment that allows homeless women to learn how to break the cycle of addiction, violence, poverty and homelessness.

The Snoqualmie Valley area is also home to **HopeLink**, an outreach program that serves low-income families, children and seniors in our area. 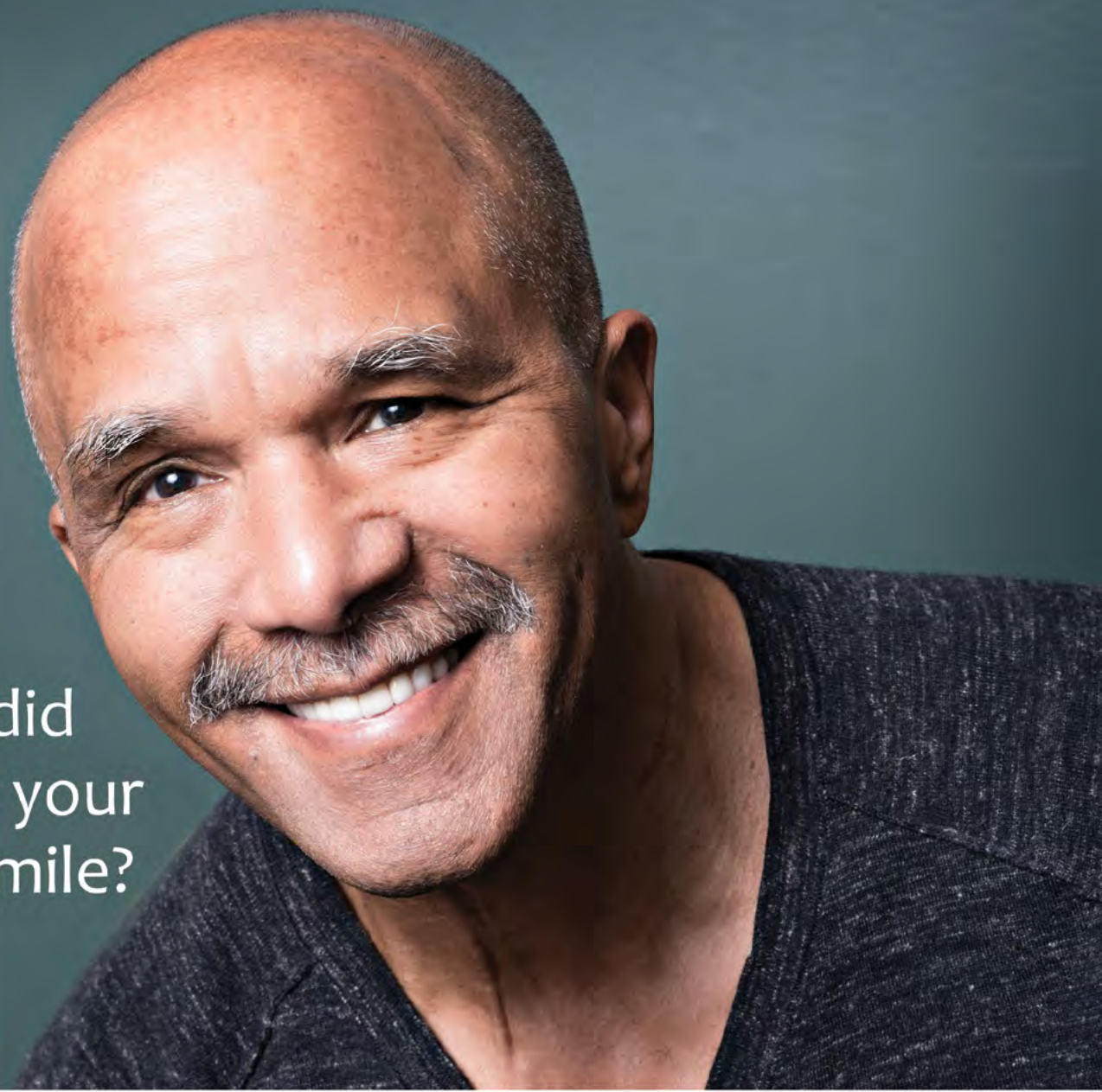

Swimming

While there are no official swimming areas within Duvall city limits, locals have found unofficial and nearby places to swim.

McCormick Park – The sandy beach and the cool Snoqualmie River make the riverbank at McCormick Park the most popular place to swim nearby. With restrooms and outdoor showers near the parking lot and ice cream at CC's Espresso within walking distance, this is a great place to spend a summer day.

Lake Margaret – Officially, the public land at Lake Margaret is designated as a boat launch for non-motorized vehicles and not for swimming. This small lake is great for kayaks, canoes, and rowboats. It is also a great place to launch an inflatable raft that can be used as a launching pad for swimmers. Note that this does require a Washington State Discover Pass, which can be purchased at the Duvall True Value hardware store.

Pine Lake Park – Located about 30 minutes away in Sammamish, Pine Lake Park offers an incredible swimming beach with lifeguards, restrooms, and a playground in the shade.

Idylwood Park – On the western shore of Lake Sammamish, Idylwood Park (located about 30 minutes away in Redmond), features a swimming beach, lifeguards, a playground, and restrooms.

Monroe YMCA – Many locals purchase memberships at the Monroe YMCA, located about 20 minutes outside of Duvall's city limits, for access to the swimming pool and swim lessons.

Snohomish Aquatic Center – Located about 30 minutes outside of city limits, the Snohomish Aquatic Center is an incredible new public swimming facility. In addition to a recreation pool, there is a lazy river, a shallow toddler area, aquatic fitness classes, and lessons.

Running

For people interested in running on surfaces other than pavement, there are several options in Duvall. Trail runners can run on the Snoqualmie River Trail at McCormick Park. The Tolt Pipeline Trail also offers an off-road experience. For a small fee, Duvall residents may rent use of the Cedarcrest High School track.

Sports

Basketball courts are located at Cherry Valley Elementary, Stillwater Elementary, Fox Hollow Park, and the 279th Avenue Sport Court. Check the Riverview School District web site for usage policies. www.duvallwa.gov/Facilities/Facility/Details/Riverview-School-District-Facilities-15

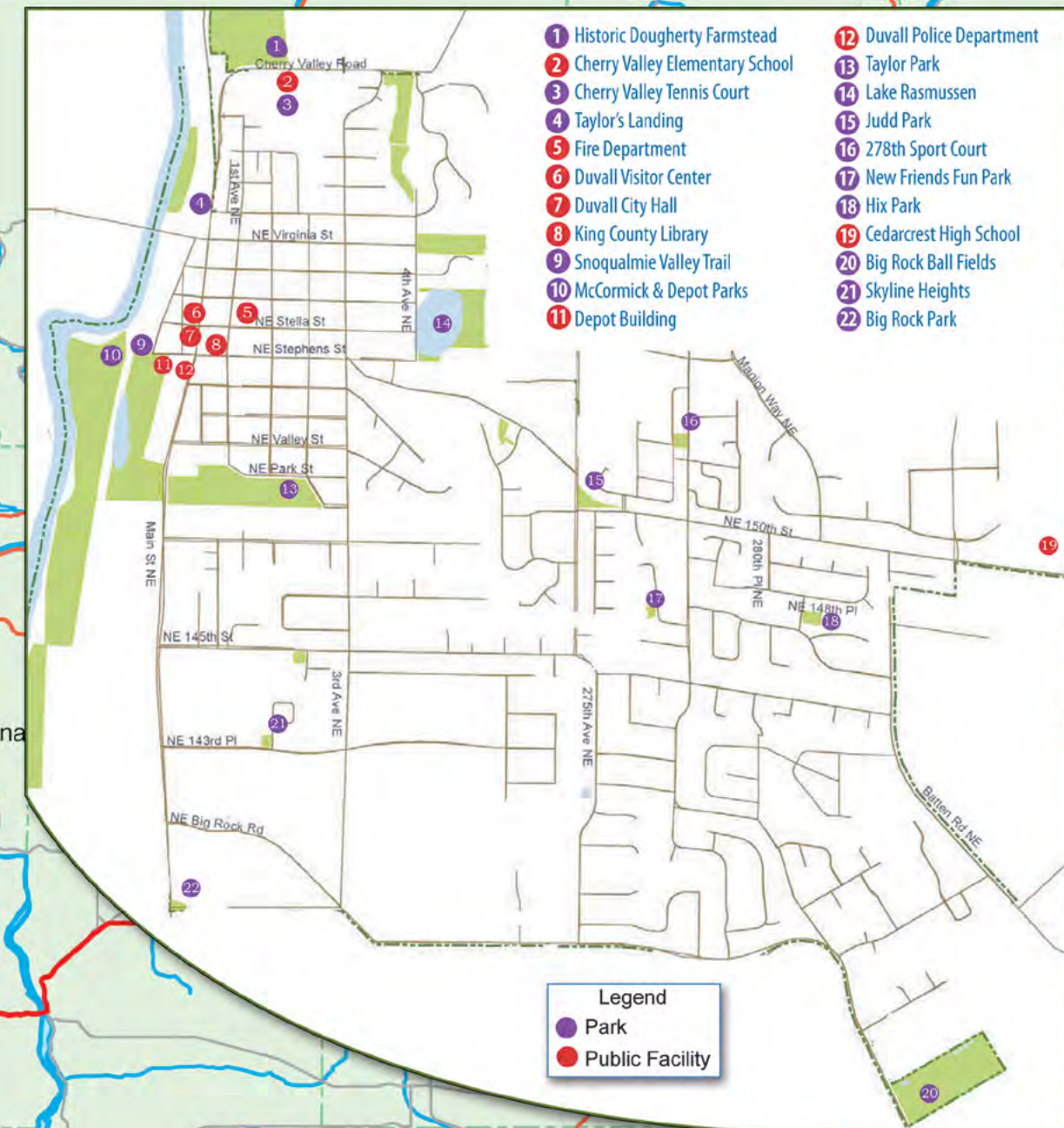

Cherry Valley Pioneer Cemetery

This cemetery, founded around 1885 and located on Cherry Valley Road adjacent to the Dougherty Farmstead, was the first cemetery for the Cherry Valley area. When the land was donated by saloon keeper James O’Leary it was believed to be a good location up on the hill away from the flooding so common in the valley.

The first burial in the cemetery came from the town of Tolt (since renamed Carnation). Unfortunately the deceased’s name and burial location have long since been lost. The second burial is believed to have been Annie Duvall, second wife of the town’s namesake James Duvall. Among the remaining bodies are Ardle Pinkerton, a Civil War veteran and cousin of the founder of the Pinkerton Detective Agency, and his wife, Corinda Woodbury of the Woodbury soap clan.

It turned out that flood waters were not a problem, but the very high water table was. It was very common for grave diggers to have to bail water out of a newly dug grave before a burial. Because of this, the cemetery was abandoned sometime between 1902 and 1905.

In 1909 and 1910 the Great Northern Railroad excavated a portion of the hill (where highway 203 now runs below the hill). About 20 bodies were moved at that time, many of them to the nearby Novelty cemetery. After the site was abandoned, the cemetery records were kept by John Clark, who stored them in the attic of his home. In 1919 all of the records were lost when his home burned to the ground.

As time passed, the cemetery was nearly forgotten and became heavily overgrown. The site was eventually donated to the Duvall Historical Society by Bill Trulson and his sister, Eleanor Zarimba, who had been maintaining it for their mother Edith Trulson prior to her death.

In 1994, with the help of the Eagle Scouts and American Legion #411, a massive cleanup effort was undertaken (no pun intended), and all of the brush and undergrowth was removed.

In 2009, with the financial help of the Rotary Club of Duvall, a white picket fence now enclosing the grounds was built and ground imaging was performed to reveal the locations of the remaining graves. It was long believed that only 11 graves remained, most having been moved during the excavation by the Great Northern Railroad. However the ground imaging led to a major discovery – instead of 11 graves, there were at least 44. Only 2 appear to be still marked and only one, Mr. Pinkerton is still readable.

Gardening in Duvall & the Lower Snoqualmie Valley

Gardening is a passion for many here, a way to make a living for others, and there are many farms in the Lower Snoqualmie Valley that raise food crops. Duvall is located in what is called a marine west coast climate – sometimes also referred to as a “Mediterranean climate.” The city of Duvall is located in the easternmost valley in this zone before the Cascade mountain range foothills begin. The plant hardiness zone is classified as a USDA 7B (sometimes getting down to 5F to 10F) right in town but quickly changing to a 7A (0F to 5F) or colder as elevation increases to the east.

The summers here are warm and dry and the winters cooler and wet. There are an average of 204 days per year with precipitation. The majority of that falls in September through April. Snowfall only occurs on an average of 20.1 days out of a year – so most of the 94.2 inches of annual precipitation is in the form of rain. The average first frost occurs during the last week of October (but it can be as early as October 1st) and the last frost occurs around mid-April (but can be as late as Mother's Day). This is a fairly long growing season, and with a little protection from the cold, you can grow some crops throughout the year.

The soil in this valley – often deep loam – is nearly ideal for growing plants. Part of the reason for that is the Snoqualmie River, which runs alongside Duvall to the west. The river rises and floods the valley at times, leaving behind wonderful soil for growing plants. There are plant nurseries and garden centers close to the town to the north, south, and west and some of the businesses in town have a great selection of plants and advice. Here are some gardening tips for the upcoming year to help you get more organized and scheduled:

As a gardener, you have your own set of deadlines, to-do's and record keeping needs. Don't miss starting your seeds on time or you'll be trying to find costly starts.

Pay attention to lawn care deadlines; lime, organic fertilizing, thatching, aerating. These are not good to do when it is 90 degrees outside.

Are you challenged by record keeping? “Are there bulbs or perennials beneath this barren ground - whoops - guess so!” Don't let this be you. Don't let this be your plants!

Some easy ways to improve your planning and record-keeping are: add important deadlines & to-do's to your Outlook calendar with yearly reminders. Photograph each bed in your landscape on the first day of each month to create an easy annual record. Try doing a 'Fury Friday' by taking the afternoon to dive into one task that has been on 'The List' for too long. While it may be hard to get started, it may be even harder to come back inside.

Make a commitment to get your Duvall & Lower Snoqualmie gardening done – one simple, teeny, tiny step at a time. If each month you've completed just one gardening goal, by the end of the year you could have a new entry garden, beautifully planted containers for your patio, a thriving veggie garden and much more. You may be THRILLED with your results but, more importantly, may have enjoyed each step along the way.

Transportation Options

King County Transit

Duvall is covered by Route 224 to Redmond, Monday through Friday with service every 90-100 minutes. The 232 provides service to Redmond/Bellevue during peak hours only, with 5AM and 5 PM trips. All King County Metro buses have bike racks, and fares start at \$2.75, with reduced fares for youth and seniors. Plan your trip online at www.kingcounty.gov/tripplanner.

Valley Shuttle

The Valley Shuttle provides weekday service to the communities of Duvall, Carnation, Fall City, Snoqualmie, and North Bend, helping people get to medical appointments, grocery stores, jobs, and their favorite activities. Buses have 3 bike racks and the suggested donation to ride is \$1, or \$.50 for seniors. Duvall's Community Art Center

Duvall Foundation for the Arts will deliver a Community Arts Center in Duvall.

The multi-room, multi-floor, 10,000 square foot facility will provide gallery space, an indoor flexible performance hall, an outdoor performance area, rain gardens, decks overlooking the valley, a meeting space for local groups, and a wedding venue— becoming a premiere art and cultural destination in the Snoqualmie Valley.

Construction of the Arts Center grounds will begin in summer 2016. The land use decisions for the project have been made by the City of Duvall and the Hearings Examiner. State environmental policy compliance, site plan approval/preliminary plat, and shoreline permits have all been approved. Milbrandt Architects have donated architectural services for the building exterior and preliminary interior layout.

Schedule

Infrastructure – Groundbreaking for site infrastructure will begin spring 2016, and includes parking, stormwater, rain gardens, water, sewer, power, access road, curbs, gutters, and sidewalks. Scheduled completion in 2016. (\$120,000)

Work on the detailed design of the building will begin early in 2016. Options to cover and dry existing building wood are currently being explored.

DFA developed a planning level overall project budget based on input from highly experienced project managers, architects, and

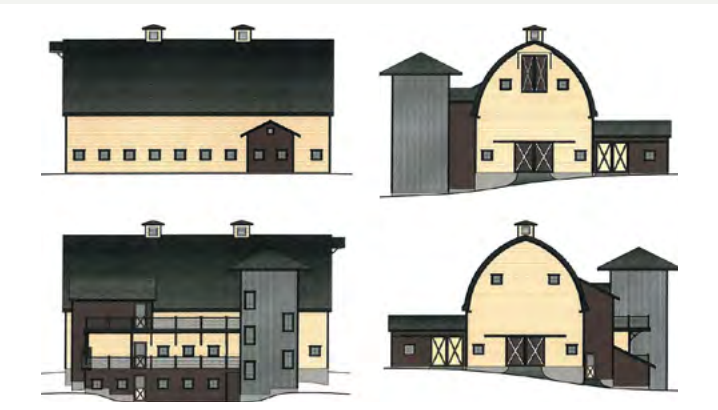
a structural engineer. The total planning level project budget is \$9,801,000 with \$2,139,500 of in-kind donations.

Community Impact Statement

The City of Duvall has made the Arts one of their critical strategies for economic development. As part of the 2015 Comprehensive Plan update the City of Duvall hired an economic development consultant that identified the need for an iconic destination. Duvall's Comprehensive Plan currently envisions a destination community with an improved Main Street, Snoqualmie Trail, Snoqualmie River, and river front parks. This Community Arts Center will tie Main Street to the Trail and River at the south end of town, which will extend the pedestrian connections between the River, Trail and town.

Community art and cultural groups currently have to lobby for event space due to a shortage of indoor space in Duvall. The Community Art Center will alleviate this problem, providing additional space for groups to gather throughout the year in this multi-use, indoor/outdoor facility.

Arts and events at this facility will benefit all ages, new and long-time residents, bedroom community dwellers, students, and children, while it addresses culturally diverse residents through art and art education, increasing public access to the arts and cultural experiences within Duvall and east King County.



DFA has reached out to key partners including community theater groups, music groups, art organizations, Chamber of Commerce, Rotary Club, and dozens of businesses, and all are eager to support and utilize this facility.

About the Charity

DFA is an integral part of the art and cultural scene in Duvall, hosting annual events like SandBlast Festival of the Arts and Art In Bloom, and awarding thousands of dollars each year in art focused Scholarships as well as the Cedarcrest Senior Art Award.
